Please make our new members welcome and give them any help and advice they wish to have.

There has been some improvements to the field. We have a shade screen suspended between both shade structures. The new pilot fence material has been completely installed. An improved cook area has been built, and the lower road has been smoothed out for any future events. Thanks to all that helped make these projects happen.

Tammi Miller was able to get the park employees help us with the clean up of the field (mostly the waste material on the south side of the container). The park employees helped load the material into a pick-up and haul it off to their large dumpster in the park. Further, any future events with large amounts of trash may be dumped off in the park. This is a great boon for the club and thanks to Tammi for making it happen.

We also have some future projects slated for the field. These are: reseal, and re-stripe the runway, and extend the poles at the main gate to hang the entrance sign higher so that large vehicles will not damage the sign.

There was some discussions about the parking at the field during events. There needs to be a

way for late comers to the field to be able to park up close to the field and unload their equipment. Also there appears to be a problem with vehicles with trailers backed up to the field causing a partial blocking of the upper access road. The solution is to try and use the lower road during events to prevent any access problems. There will be a designated area that will only be used as temporary parking in order to unload or load equipment and supplies as needed.

Our second annual warbird meet is scheduled for August 11th and 12th 2007. The lower road will be used for this event, with ample parking south of the field. There will also be a P40 84" wing span ARF for the main raffle prize. Lunch will also be served for a nominal donation. Any model can fly at the meet if the full sized version was flown in any war. Come on out the see the collection of warbirds at this event.

We are getting pretty lax about putting both our current club card and current AMA card up on the frequency when checking out a pin. Please ensure that both of these cards are placed on the board when getting a frequency pin. If you do not provide both documents prior to obtaining a frequency pin, then you run the risk of being denied flying privileges until such documents can be presented. If you see that only an AMA card or some other non-authorized card is posted on the frequency board, please find out if that person is a member, or, if not, who their club sponsor is. Also inform the sponsor about the three flying appearances at the field for their non member flyers prior to joining the club.

RC Airplane Definitions

Prop Nut: What a glider pilot calls power pilots.
