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### Current News

The June club meeting will be held on June 11th at the flying field at 11:30am. Prior to that, we will be having another field maintenance day starting at 8:00am and ending at 11.30am just prior to the club meeting. The field work will be mainly scraping and gathering the loose oil slurry put on the field. This will aid in both a better job by the paving contractor but will reduce the overall cost required to pave the field. Please plan on coming out. We will need flat shovels, long handle scrapers, brooms, maybe a leaf blower or two.

The pylon races were held on May 14-15, 2016. We have a fair amount of participants (less than last year) due to a couple of large pylon races coming up. In spite a couple of startup problems during the start of the event, it went pretty smoothly.

There will be an IMAC aerobatic contest on June 25-26 2016. We will be having lunch there as well. Volunteers would be much appreciated to help out. Please contact any club officer for information.

We also had an Officers Meeting on May 7th to discuss the bid packages for the field paving project. Upon review, one of the bidders did not do a walk-through and another proposed using a material inferior to what we required when sending out for requests for quotes (FRQ). Because both of the above bidders did not meet the performance requirements of the RFQ. they were not considered.

Many thanks to Dave Vickers for taking lead for these proposals. Here is a summary of the findings:

Here are a few points to include in your notice to the members regarding the runway bids.

- Three bids were received from the nine invited Contractors
- One bid was rejected as the Contractor did not do a site inspect, as required
- One bid was rejected as the proposed material did not meet the project specifications
- One bid was accepted and is within the amount estimated for the project. The bid by VSS International was signed by the President and will be returned to the Contractor 5/9/16. The actual time and date of construction to be announced, construction is projected to be in the next 6 to 8 weeks. All work will be done during the week.

At least one possibly two work days are being scheduled to scrap the runway of loose material, the first will be 6/11/16.

2. Pavement structure should not be an issue as there trucks are not as heavy as the Fire Dept. Water Tankers.
3. We should continue with the runway scraping, yippy.....
